3. Consider and discuss road closures for Kids Fishing Day — Jackie Boyer

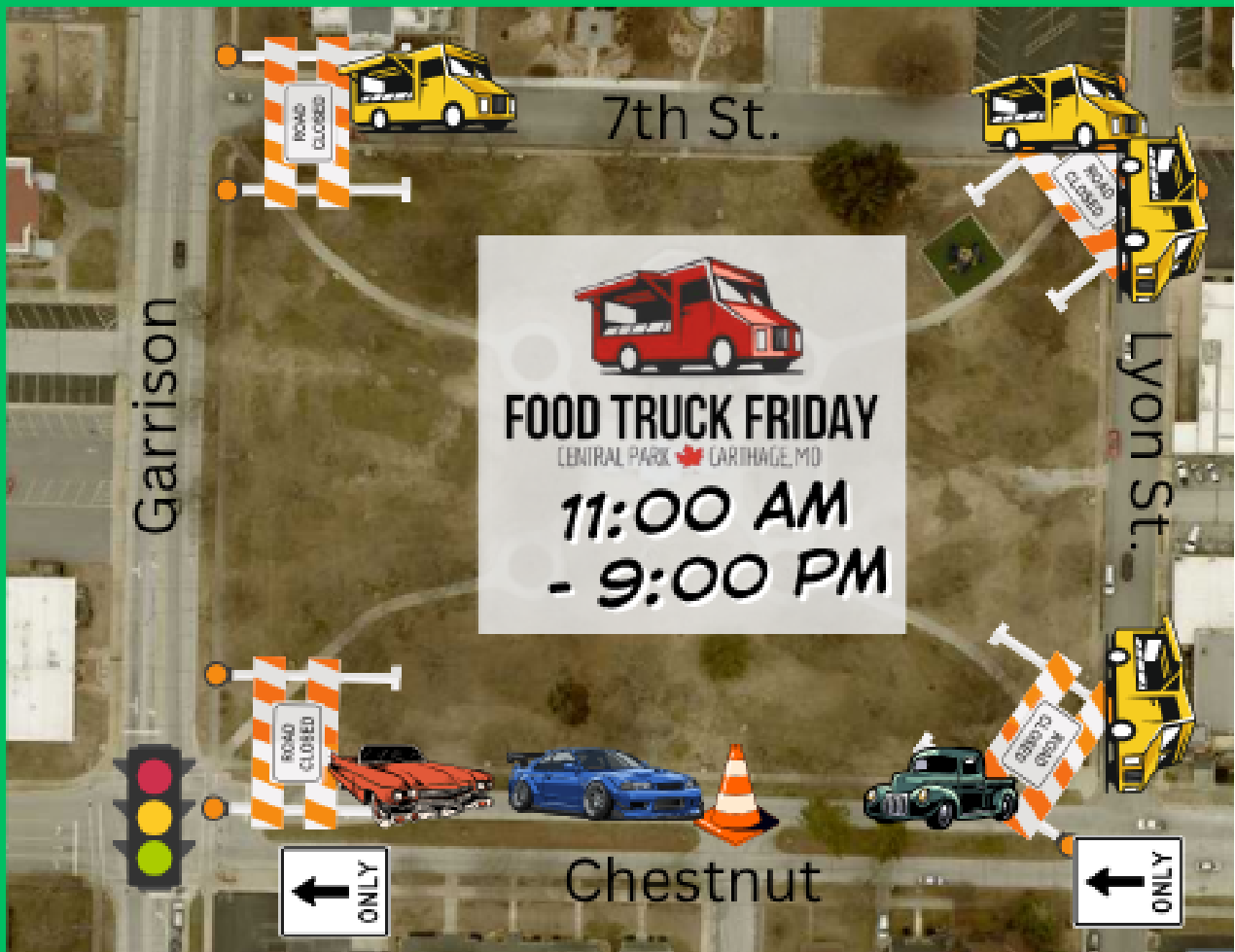
Jackie Boyer spoke with the committee about the Kids Fishing Day event to be held on Saturday, June 6th. She requested street closures within Kellogg Lake

JCYF is an annual event held the 2nd full week of July each year at Carthage Municipal Livestock Barns. We are excited to kick off this year's fair with a new 40'x60' Poultry Barn, added wash bays & water way, new 4-H concession pavilion, sunshades for wash areas, & heat/ac in the restrooms. These projects were funded by grants from Steadley Foundation, McCune Brooks Hospital Trust Foundation, and Helen S Boylan Foundation. In addition, funding was made available through Jasper County Youth Fair Market Sale participants, & 4-H Parents Association, Joplin Concrete, ILC, and Trimline Barns.

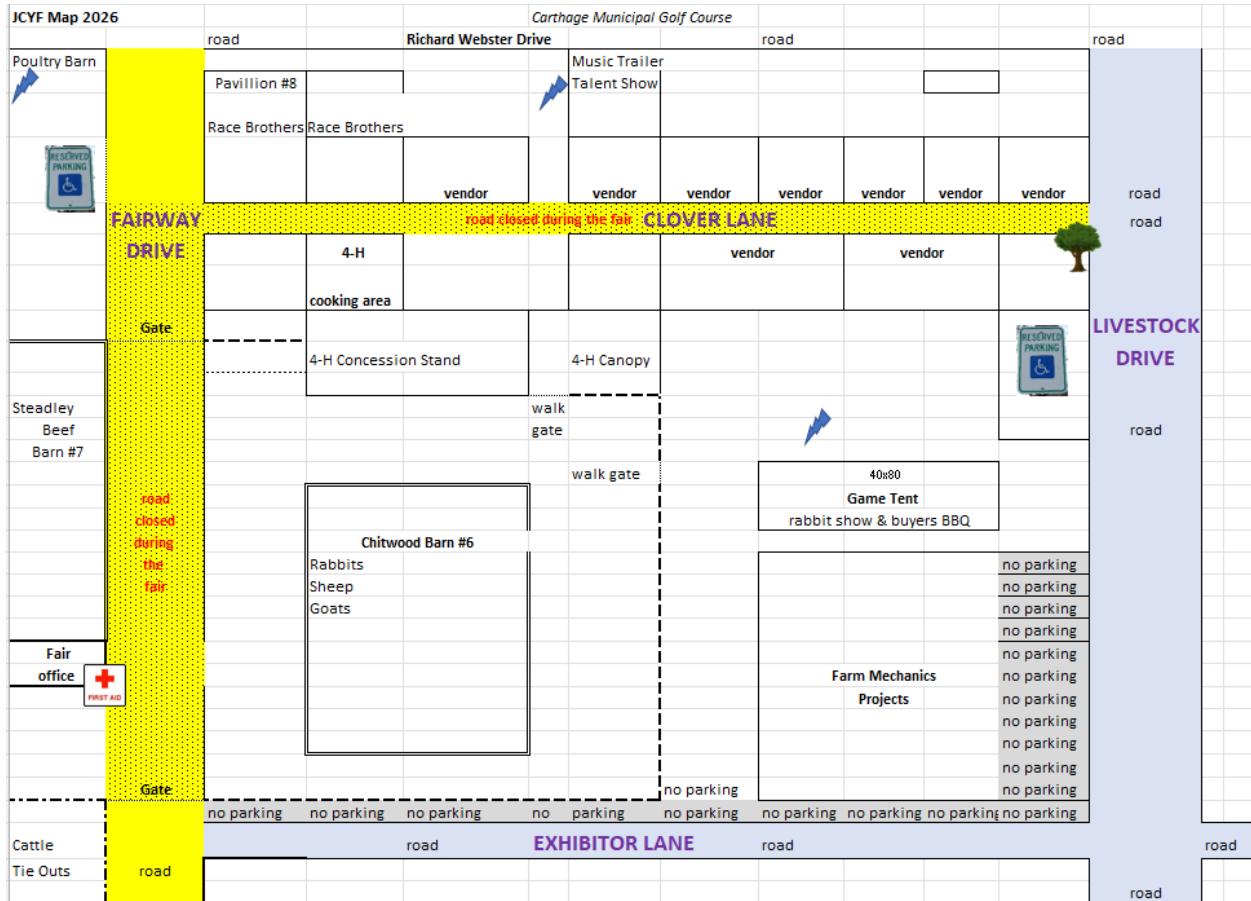
During this year's event we would like to formally request the following:

- Close the road newly known as Fairway Drive from gate to gate beginning Tuesday night at midnight, July 14 through Saturday, July 18 to keep livestock contained within the perimeter fence. Closure of this road will also increase the safety of exhibitors and spectators eliminating moving vehicles.
- Close the road, newly known as Clover Lane, from Wednesday to Saturday as well. In addition, we are requesting that Food Trucks be allowed in this area from Monday, July 13 through Saturday, July 18.
- We also request campers be allowed in the park on Saturday, July 11 through Sunday, July 18 for our exhibitor families. Children exhibiting during the fair are also requesting special permission to be in the park around the livestock area after 10pm to care for livestock and provide security of exhibits. Additional police patrol during this event is welcomed and appreciated.

Included is a map of the event layout. We appreciate your consideration and support of the youth in Jasper County who support agriculture, horticulture, domestic science and art. Jasper County Youth Fair will clean up the fairgrounds on Sunday, July 18. Our intention is to improve the facilities and keep the fair in Carthage, Mo. We pledge to leave the fairgrounds in better condition than we found them following the fair.

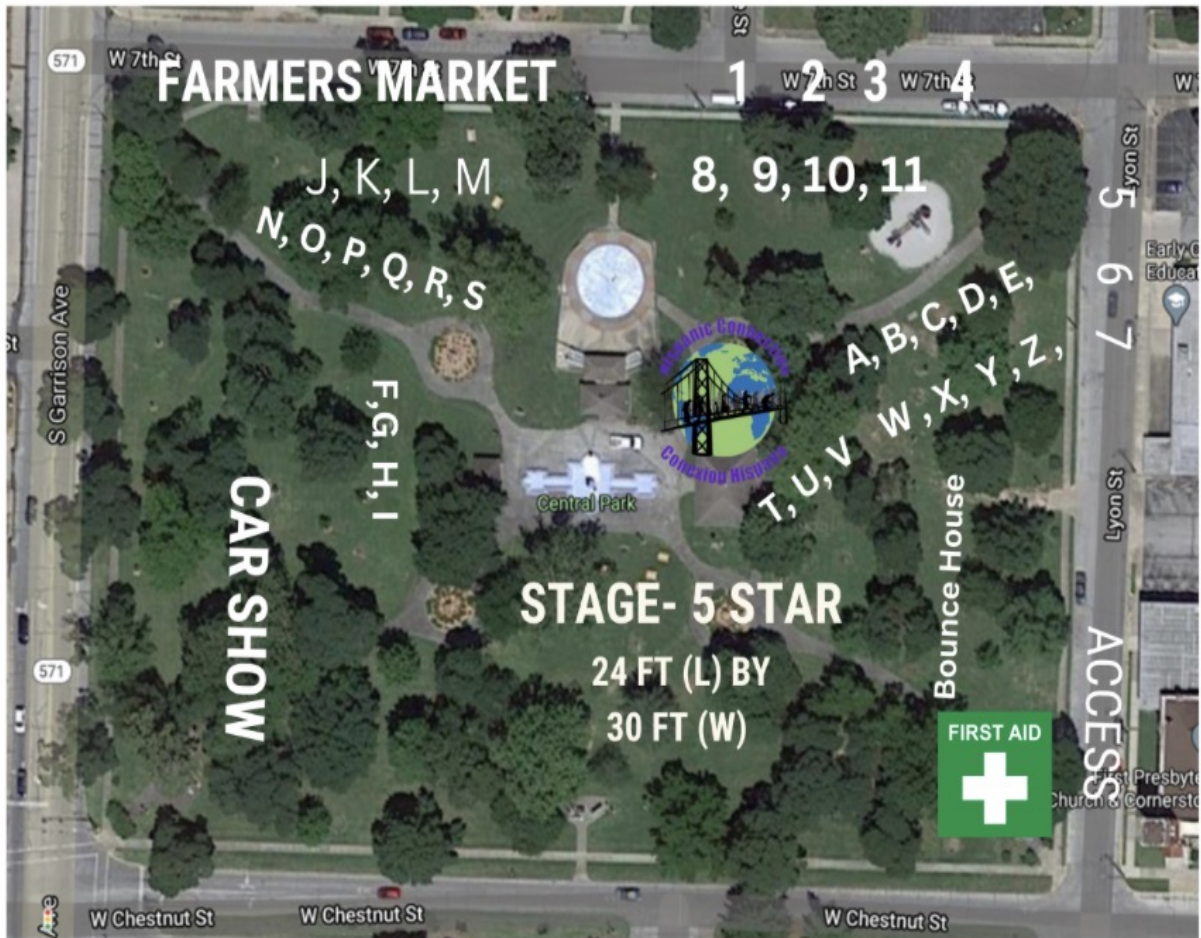

Carthage Fire Department

County Burning Regulations

Any waste generated by a business, trade, industry, salvage or demolition operation cannot be burned without a permit issued by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources or the Carthage Fire Department. Permits will only be considered for untreated wood wastes. Wastes that may not be burned include but are not limited to tires, rubber products, hazardous materials, Styrofoam™, plastics, petroleum-based products, demolition waste, treated wood, any asbestos-containing material, or wiring of any kind.

Open Burning of Household Refuse- Open burning of household refuse is allowed provided it originates and is burned on the same premises. This does not apply to mobile home parks or apartment complexes. Residential waste is solid waste produced by routine household activities, such as paper waste and garbage from daily activities. This does not include home remodeling wastes, wastes from home businesses, durable goods such as old appliances, carpets or furniture, tires or other non-routine household waste. Materials such as tires or used oil may not be used to start the fires or burned in fires.

Open Burning of Yard Wastes- Open burning of yard waste is allowed provided it originates and is burned on the same premises. Materials such as tires or used oil may not be used to start the fires or burned in fires. Yard waste includes trees, tree leaves, brush or other vegetation.

Open Burning in Agricultural, Natural Resource or Land Management Operations- Agricultural burning is allowed but with exceptions. Materials such as tires or used oil may not be used to start the fires or burned in fires. Any burning that creates a health hazard, nuisance or produces smoke that impairs visibility for those operating motor vehicles or airplanes is prohibited.

Open Burning in Land Clearing Operations-Open burning of tree trunks, tree limbs and vegetation from land clearing operations is allowed if the burning takes place outside the city limits and at least 200 yards from the nearest inhabited dwelling. Materials such as tires or used oil may not be used to start the fires or burned in fires. Permits containing special conditions may be issued by the Carthage Fire Department or Missouri DNR regional offices.

Open Burning for Recreational Purposes-Campfires and other fires used solely for recreational purposes, ceremonial occasions or for outdoor noncommercial preparation of food are allowed. Fires shall include only vegetative woody materials or untreated wood products.

Open Burning Permit: A permit that must be applied for and then granted in order to open burn or open burn with restrictions. Permit applications must be sent to a Missouri DNR Regional Office. Applications are available at www.dnr.mo.gov/forms or the Carthage Fire Department at 417-237 7100 or visit at 401 West Chestnut, Carthage Mo.

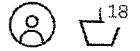
Open Burning Regulations

Regulations for burning are established to prevent fire damage resulting from open burning activities that get out of control, prevent the discharge of pollutants into the atmosphere, and protect others from hazardous smoke conditions.



The Fire Department MUST be notified prior to any burning. 417-237-7100

REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 10-2 OF THE CARTHAGE CITY CODE:

- ❖ Open burning of yard waste is allowed provided it originates and is burned on the same premises and unless a permit by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources is issued which supersedes these regulations.
- ❖ Yard waste must consist of tree limbs, leaves, brush, or untreated and unpainted wood wastes
- ❖ Open burning is permitted between the hours of **7:00 AM to 10:00PM**
- ❖ The Fire Department **MUST** be notified prior to any open burning
- ❖ Fires in approved containers may be no less than **15 feet** from any structure
- ❖ Fires not in containers must be no less than **25 feet** from any structure
- ❖ Fires must be no larger than **3 feet** in diameter and **2 feet** high
- ❖ Fires larger than the designated size must be no less than **50 feet** from any structure and require approval from the Carthage Fire Department
- ❖ Fires must be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished
- ❖ A fire extinguisher with minimum 4-A rating, charged water hose, or other approved extinguishing equipment must be available for immediate utilization
- ❖ Fires **may not** be burned on any improved street, sidewalk, or alley
- ❖ Fires **may not** cause a hazardous condition of any kind
- ❖ Fire **may not** be burned during the time that a burn ban is issued
- ❖ Fire Department personnel have the authority to order the extinguishment of any fire not within regulations.
